Boys Soccer

The Regina boys soccer team won its 2nd consecutive Class 1A State Championship in double overtime over Ft. Madison Holy Trinity in June. Rick Larew was named small school State Coach of the Year by the State Soccer Coaches Assoc., the Midwest region small school Coach of the Year by the National Soccer Coaches Assoc. of America and is one of eight candidates for National Coach of the Year award.



Boys Cross Country

The Regina boys cross country team won the Class 2A State Championship title. It was the boys' 18th consecutive trip to state, where they have never finished lower than 7th, something no other school from any class has done. Coach **Chad Swope '89** was selected as the Iowa Association of Track Coaches Boys 2A Cross Country State Coach of the Year. The girls' team placed third in State.

The team finished the season with an undefeated record of 14-0, making school history with the most wins of any Regal football team. The Regina Dance Team competed at State on December 2nd and won first place in the jazz category, first place in the hip hop category and received a Division I rating in lyrical. Additionally, they were recognized for outstanding community service and received the Distinguished Academic Award.

Dan served in various capacities at Regina High School from 1974 to 1985, before moving to Mason City, where he received several awards in honor of years spent as athletic director at Mason City High School.

Former Regina assistant basketball coach and current Wichita Heights, KS, head coach, **Joe Auer '83**, led his team to a second consecutive Class 6A state championship, with a 23-2 record. 





Regina began to bus its own students in 2010-2011 after the Iowa City Community School District discontinued service. Regina now partners with CIT Charters Inc. to bus its students.



Also new to Regina this year is a dress code...navy, white and yellow shirts with the Regina crest and khaki and plaid jumpers for the young ladies.



Regina secured \$75,000 in grants to execute a pre-engineering curriculum called *Project Lead the Way*. All junior high students participate as part of the science curriculum and senior high students can take the classes as electives.



Thanks to the success of the Regina Foundation 2009-2010 Annual Appeal, many updates to the school's technology system, including infrastructure updates, interactive whiteboards and replacement of computers and LCD projectors were completed over the summer and continue to be fine-tuned this fall.



Regina also began a new tuition rate structure for the 2010-2011 school year, replacing stewardship, non-stewardship and out-of-parish are parish stewardship, school stewardship and full tuition. Parish stewardship requires approval of parishes and school stewardship, 36 hours of parental service to Regina and participation in Regina's SCRIP program.
